Please Support ESHB 2545 The Toxic-Free Kids and Families Act that Passed the House 76-21!

- Our children deserve a safe and healthy world, not exposure to toxic chemicals.
- Many of the flame retardants used in children's products and in the home are toxic.
- There are safer alternatives to toxic flame retardants.
- Toxic flame retardants are being phased out by major businesses and states are putting in place restrictions.

The Problem

- Current state law prevents our state's health agency from prohibiting these cancer---causing and other harmful chemicals. Other states, including Oregon, California and Minnesota can prohibit them.
- As a result, toxic flame retardants are found in many everyday products in our homes.
- These chemicals escape into the air and dust and then can enter our bodies.
- Babies and other young children are more vulnerable than adults.
- Commonly used chemical flame retardants are linked to cancer, harm to brain development, hormone disruption, thyroid effects, and obesity.
- Chlorinated Tris compounds including TDCPP and TCEP have been designated as carcinogens.

 PBDEs, HBCD, and TBBPA are persistent toxic chemicals that last a long time in the environment.



The Solution: Pass the Toxic--- Free Kids & Families Act

- Bans 5 flame retardants (TCEP, TDCPP, additive TBBPA, HBCD, and Deca (BDE) in children's products and furniture.
- Gives the state's health department the authority to restrict 6 additional flame retardants in children's products and furniture. In 2015, the Department of Ecology recommended banning the 6 additional flame retardants due to health concerns and the availability of safer alternatives.
- Ensures that safer effective alternatives are available.
