A Good Place to Start: EM/WAIPL's Legislative Priorities and Action Page. Here you can learn about the legislation that EM/WAIPL supports and how to take action on them. We suggest you bookmark this page and check it regularly for updates and time-sensitive actions! We also recommend signing up for their action alerts.

Sign-Up for Action Alerts!

The easiest way track and act on important legislative priorities is by signing up to receive action alerts from one or more environmental organizations, especially EM/WAIPL (see above). They often contain links to the legislature's web page where you can indicate your position (pro or con) for a particular bill. It's effective, easy to do and only takes 1-2 minutes to complete!

Note: To reduce the number of action alerts you receive from us, we will not be forwarding all action alerts from EM/WAIPL. Don't risk missing out on key opportunities to take action! 
Action Alerts Sign Up (not available)

City of Bellingham Legislative Priorities: In addition to supporting the legislative priorities of Earth Ministry/WAIPL, the MNCJ also supports legislation that would support the implementation of the City of Bellingham's Climate Action Plan. We are in communication with city staff about this and will be sending out occasional action alerts related to their legislative priorities as well. Stay tuned for more!

How the State Legislature Works

Washington State Legislature

- Policy Committee
 - o "First Reading" = introduction
 - o Public Hearing sign in/testify
 - o "Executive Session" = vote
- Fiscal Committee
 - o Only if there's an associated cost AKA "fiscal note"
 - Senate Ways & Means, House Appropriations
- Rules Committee
- Floor vote!
- Repeat in opposite chamber
- If passed, Governor reviews and signs/vetoes



When to take action:

You will have the opportunity to either state your position, submit written testimony and/or testify remotely when a bill is in <u>each committee</u> and <u>during the floor vote</u>. This means at least <u>four times</u> for each bill!
