Faith Community Engagement in Advocacy

Partisan Politics = NO!

- Endorsing candidates
- Encouraging others to vote for a particular candidate

Non-Profit Advocacy = YES!

- Non-partisan voter engagement
- Taking a position
 - On an issue, bill, or ballot measure
- Educating others, asking them to act
- Asking an elected official to vote a certain way
- Requesting an agency take a particular action



Washington State Legislature

1. Policy Committee

- "First Reading" = introduction
- Public Hearing sign in/testify
- "Executive Session" = vote
- 2. Fiscal Committee
 - Only if there's an associated cost AKA "fiscal note"
 - Senate Ways & Means, House Appropriations
- 3. Rules Committee
- 4. Floor vote!
- 5. Repeat in opposite chamber
- 6. If passed, Governor reviews and signs/vetoes



Rules Committee

- Purpose: to decide which bills get to the floor for a vote.
- A bill must be pulled in order to be taken to the floor for a vote.
- The Rules Committee also reviews, adopts and schedules consideration of floor resolutions.







Earth Ministry/WAIPL's 2023 Priority Bills

Growth Management Act (GMA) Updates

Climate: HB 1181 / SB 5203 (Rep. Duerr/Sen. Lovelett) UPDATE: Referred to House Rules!! Stalled in the Senate

- Requires counties/cities to address resilience and climate change in land use plans
- Incorporates transit and bike/pedestrian planning

Environmental Justice HB 1723/SB 5651

- (Rep. Duerr/Sen. Lovelett)
- **UPDATE: Stalled in House, Stalled in Rules**
 - Requires that EJ and climate change are explicitly addressed to reduce health disparities
 - Better, more equitable public participation requirements and funding





Earth Ministry/WAIPL's 2023 Priority Bills

WA Recycling and Packaging Act (WRAP Act): SB 5154 / HB 1131 (Sen. Rolfes/Rep. Berry) UPDATE: Referred to House Rules!! Stalled in Senate

- Requires consumer product producers to fund statewide residential recycling services for packaging and paper products - graduated fees based on products' ability to be reused, composted, or recycled
- Graduated fees based on products' ability to be reused, composted, or recycled
- Shifts costs/responsibilities to manufacturers



Earth Ministry/WAIPL's 2023 Priority Bills

Toxic-Free Cosmetics Act: HB 1047 (Rep. Mena)

UPDATE: Referred to House Rules!!

- Bans hazardous chemicals including PFAS, phthalates, formaldehyde, and lead in cosmetics and personal care products by 2025
- Fills gaps in info on hazards and provides incentives for small businesses to make safer products
